Cavalleria rusticana

Turiddu returned from the army to find his lover Lola married to Alfio. He consoled himself by seducing Santuzza, but has now abandoned her for an adulterous affair with Lola.

Turiddu is heard singing of his love for Lola. As villagers prepare for Easter Sunday celebrations, Santuzza arrives to see Turiddu. His mother, Lucia, tells her that he is not there. Alfio arrives, and enthuses about his enjoyable job and lovely wife. He mentions in passing that he saw Turiddu near his house that morning.

The villagers sing the Easter Hymn. While everyone else goes on to church, Santuzza and Mamma Lucia stay behind. Santuzza tells Lucia how Turiddu has abandoned her, and of her shame and sorrow. She asks Mamma Lucia to pray for her.

Santuzza confronts Turiddu about his affair with Lola, and he accuses her of irrational jealousy. Lola passes by on her way to church and mocks Santuzza. After she has left, Santuzza and Turiddu quarrel – he rejects her and she curses him. Santuzza tells Alfio about Lola's affair with Turiddu.

Intermezzo

Turiddu is celebrating with friends when Alfio arrives, and challenges him to a duel. Turiddu tells his mother that he is leaving on a journey, and that if he does not return she must be kind to Santuzza. After he has gone, Santuzza, Lucia and other villagers gather anxiously. Suddenly, a woman cries out that Turiddu has been killed.

Pagliacci

Prologue

Tonio, one of the actors, informs the audience that they will see a drama about real people.

Act I

An acting troupe arrives in the village. Their leader, Canio, announces that their play will be about the cuckolded husband Pagliaccio. The villagers invite the male actors to drink with them. When Tonio says that he will stay behind, the villagers joke that he wants to flirt with Canio's wife Nedda; Canio's response reveals his jealous nature.

Alone, Nedda frets about her husband's jealousy and envies the birds their freedom. Tonio emerges from hiding and confesses his love for her. She rejects him and strikes him. Tonio vows revenge. He gets his chance when he hears Nedda talking to her secret lover, Silvio, with whom she decides to elope that night. They are nearly caught when Canio, alerted by Tonio, arrives. Canio orders Nedda to reveal her lover's identity, but she refuses. Beppe tells them that the play is about to begin. Canio gets ready, lamenting that he must play the clown while his heart is breaking.

Interlude

Act II

The actors' play mirrors the troupe's real-life situation. Colombina (Nedda) rejects her flirtatious servant Taddeo (Tonio) and takes advantage of the absence of her husband Pagliaccio (Canio) to enjoy supper with her secret lover Arlecchino (Beppe). When Pagliaccio unexpectedly returns, Arlecchino escapes. Pagliaccio demands that Colombina reveal her lover's name. Nedda – though not the audience – soon realizes that Canio is not acting. She attempts to keep to the script, and when this fails refuses to betray her lover. Canio kills her. Silvio runs onto the stage where Canio also kills him. Tonio tells the horrified audience that 'the play is over'.
